I (Sarah) recently helped lead orality week at the missionary training school in Clarkston, GA. I helped teach the students how to craft Bible stories in a way that is natural, biblically accurate, relevant to a specific people group, and reproducible. As I watched the students present Bible stories they'd chosen and crafted in chronological order, I was filled with thanksgiving to God for His story of love for us. There's just something about hearing God's word told as one big story made up of multiple smaller stories that helps me see connections from the Old to New Testament and God's amazing plan. We had a brief devotion afterwards and I loved hearing how God's Word impacted people. One person said that God is creative in how He talks with us. Another was reminded to keep her eyes on Jesus even when she's tired and stressed. It was so nice to use my past training and experience to help potential future missionaries learn about the importance of storying. The students did a great job and several told me they are excited to use Bible storying in ministry. One told me it was his favorite week so far. Several of the staff are talking about meeting regularly to practice telling Bible stories. I'm excited about this opportunity and anxious to see how God uses us.

While in Clarkston, we were able to find a place to live! We'll be moving to a 2-bedroom apartment. We're excited because we already know some people living in the apartment complex, there are many refugee families living there, and it's close to the training school. We also accepted an offer on our house in Indiana. If all goes well, we should be moving in mid-November!



Besides setting up an agriculture program, Travis will also be helping fill a big need for Global Frontier Missions (GFM): maintenance. The importance of taking care of odd jobs is often overlooked, but the leaders at GFM are very appreciative of Travis's help.





In our last update we told you a little bit about an indigenous missionary named Jeremias that Hope Remembered has partnered with for many years. Travis has been working with him to make sure he has the resources that he needs to do the work that God has called him to do. Now that we have helped him purchase the land that he needs to build his school we would like to help him raise the funds that he needs for construction. The school year is about to start so there was no time to build a permanent structure but we were able to send funds to help him clear the land, build bathrooms, and build some temporary classrooms to use for this school year. As you can see in the picture they aren't fancy but these types of temporary class rooms are common in Guinea Bissau. He is currently designing and getting estimates on what it will cost to build a larger permanent structure so that he can accommodate more students and expand his ministry.
