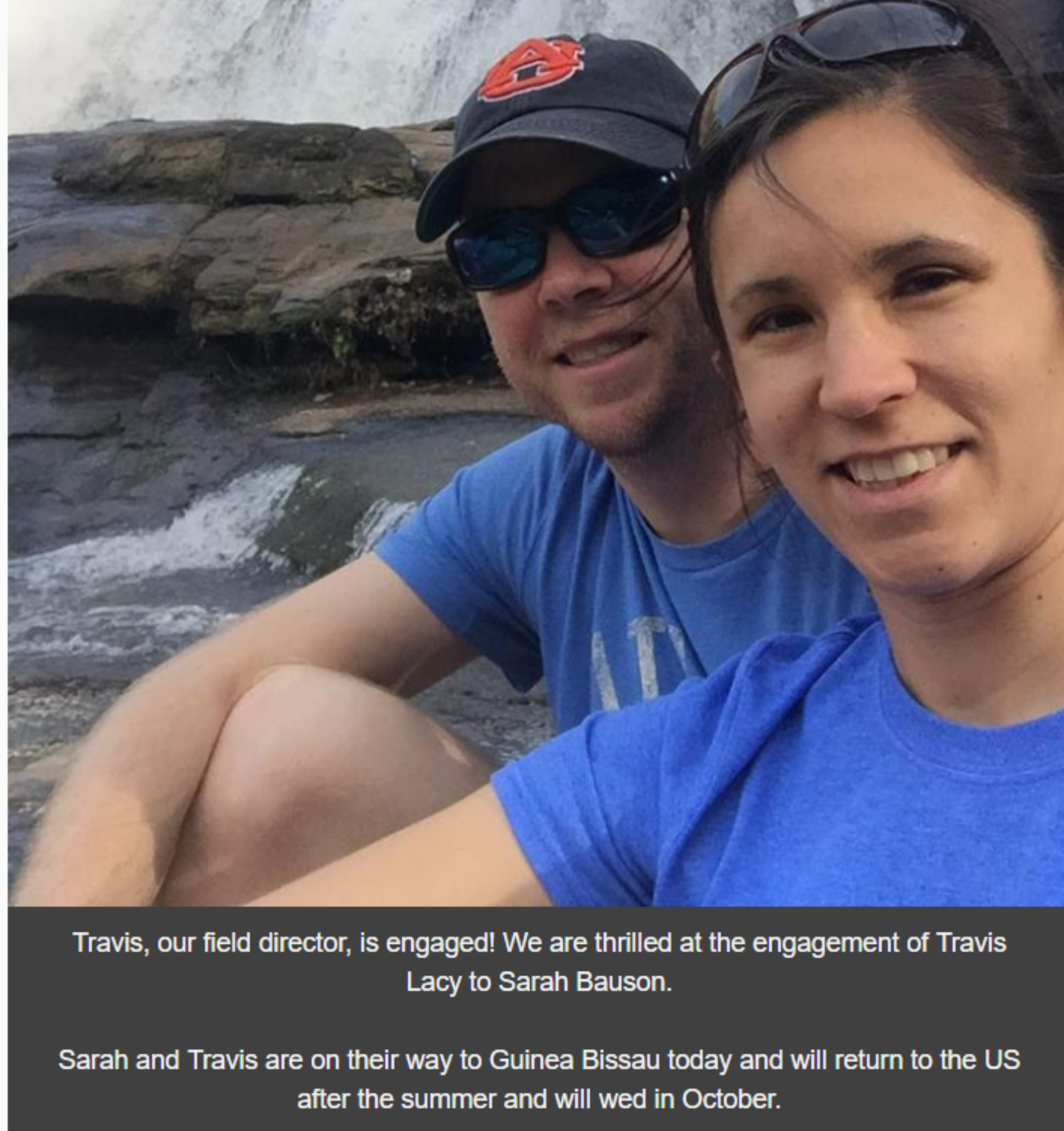

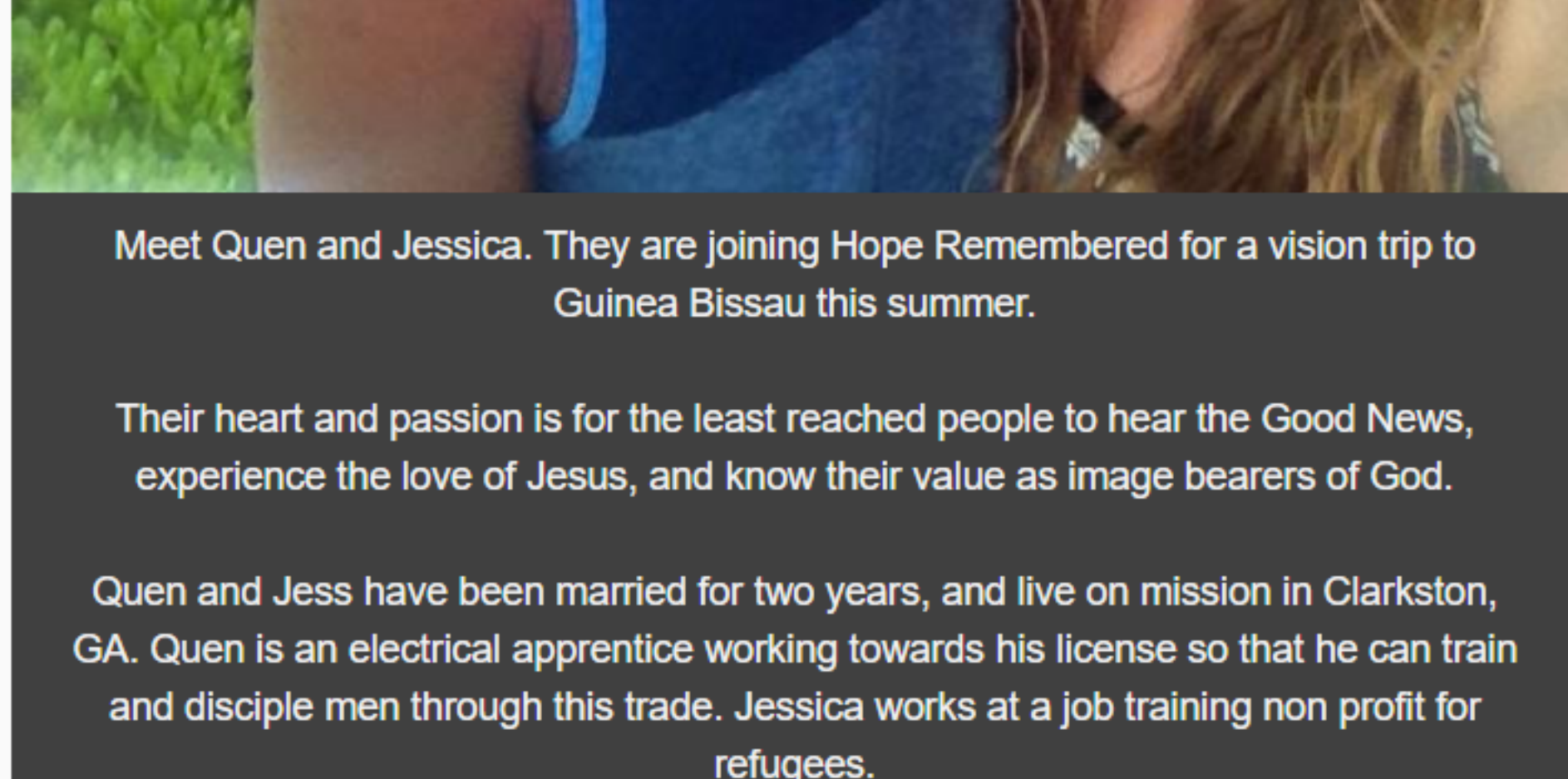


Travis, our field director, is engaged! We are thrilled at the engagement of Travis Lacy to Sarah Bauson.

Meet Quen and Jessica. They are joining Hope Remembered for a vision trip to Guinea Bissau this summer.

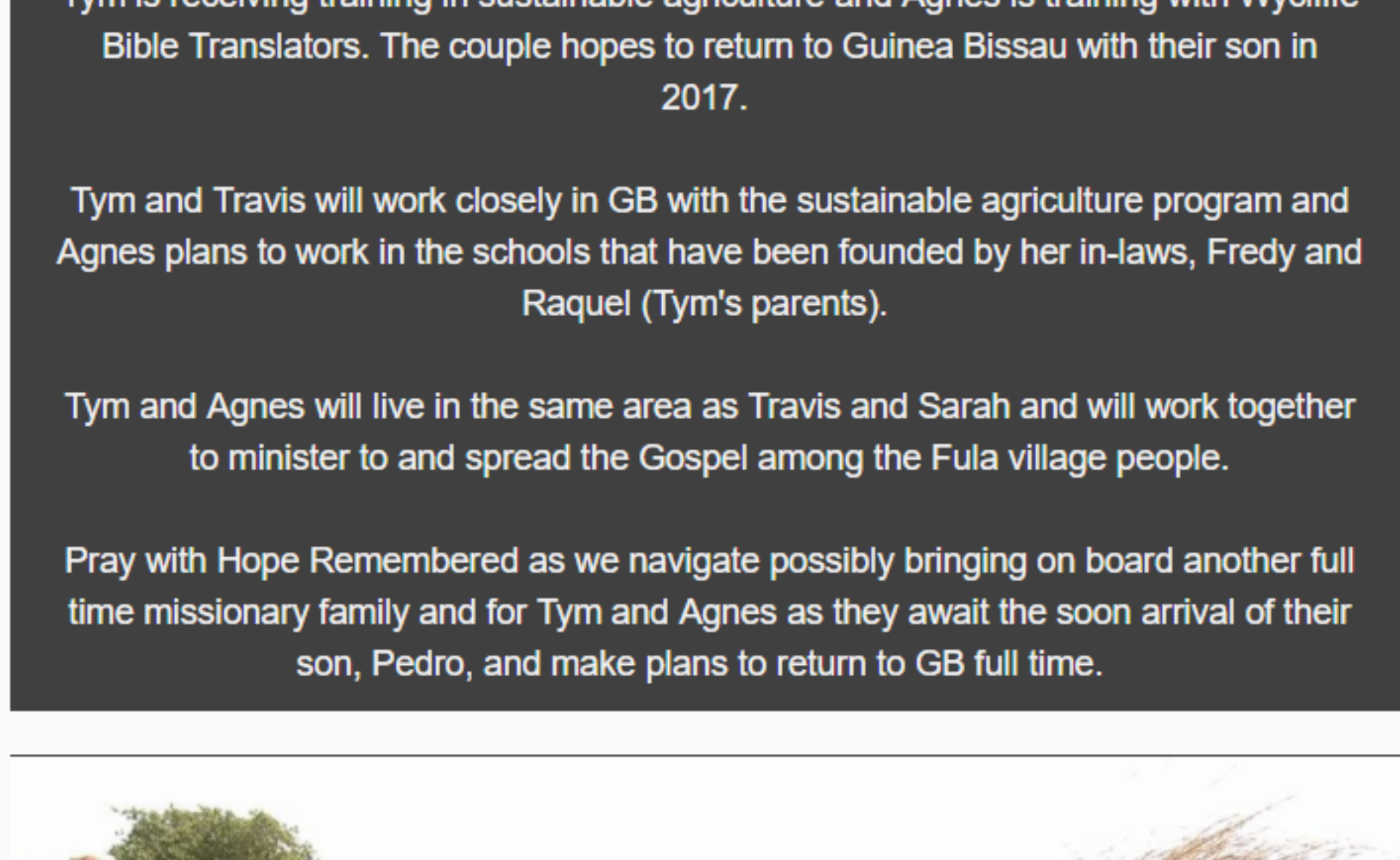
Their heart and passion is for the least reached people to hear the Good News, experience the love of Jesus, and know their value as image bearers of God.

Tym is receiving training in sustainable agriculture and Agnes is training with Wycliffe Bible Translators. The couple hopes to return to Guinea Bissau with their son in 2017.

Tym and Travis will work closely in GB with the sustainable agriculture program and Agnes plans to work in the schools that have been founded by her in-laws, Fredy and Raquel (Tym's parents).

Tym and Agnes will live in the same area as Travis and Sarah and will work together to minister to and spread the Gospel among the Fula village people.

Pray with Hope Remembered as we navigate possibly bringing on board another full time missionary family and for Tym and Agnes as they await the soon arrival of their son, Pedro, and make plans to return to GB full time.



Meet Maritza. This servant of the Lord is a personal treasure to me (Grace) and to many others. Without Maritza on the ground in Guinea Bissau there would not have been a Hope Remembered.

Maritza is originally from Costa Rica but also called Buffalo, NY home for many years. After retiring from teaching the Lord called her to serve with Casa Emanuel in Bissau, the capital of GB.

She wears many hats at the orphanage including navigating the legal paperwork for adopting families as well as being the principal of Liceu Comunitario Emanuel, a school founded by orphanage director, Dr. Isabel Johannning. Through her leadership at the school we were able to start and maintain our student sponsorship program.

Maritza, for the last three years, has been our only English speaking contact in GB. That means in addition to her responsibilities at the orphanage, she has developed and overseen every project Hope Remembered has completed.

My words are not adequate enough to say how thankful I am personally for her friendship and guidance.

To Dr. Isabel Johannning as well, who continues to teach me what it looks like to fear nothing but the Lord, to trust in Him fully for every step of every day, and to rest in knowing His power is far greater than any other.



Meet Fredy and Raquel. This couple is truly a treasure to all of us at Hope Remembered. Originally from Brazil, Fredy and Raquel raised their biological children in Guinea Bissau and now dozens more Guinean children call them mom and dad.

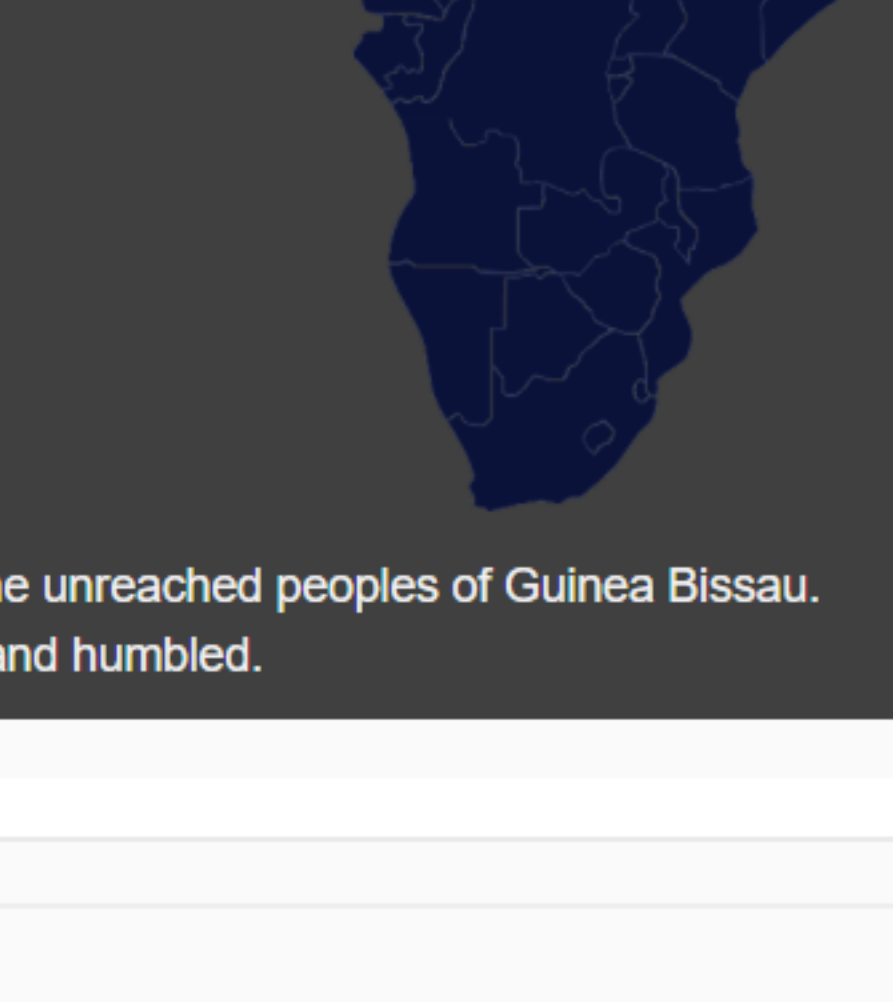
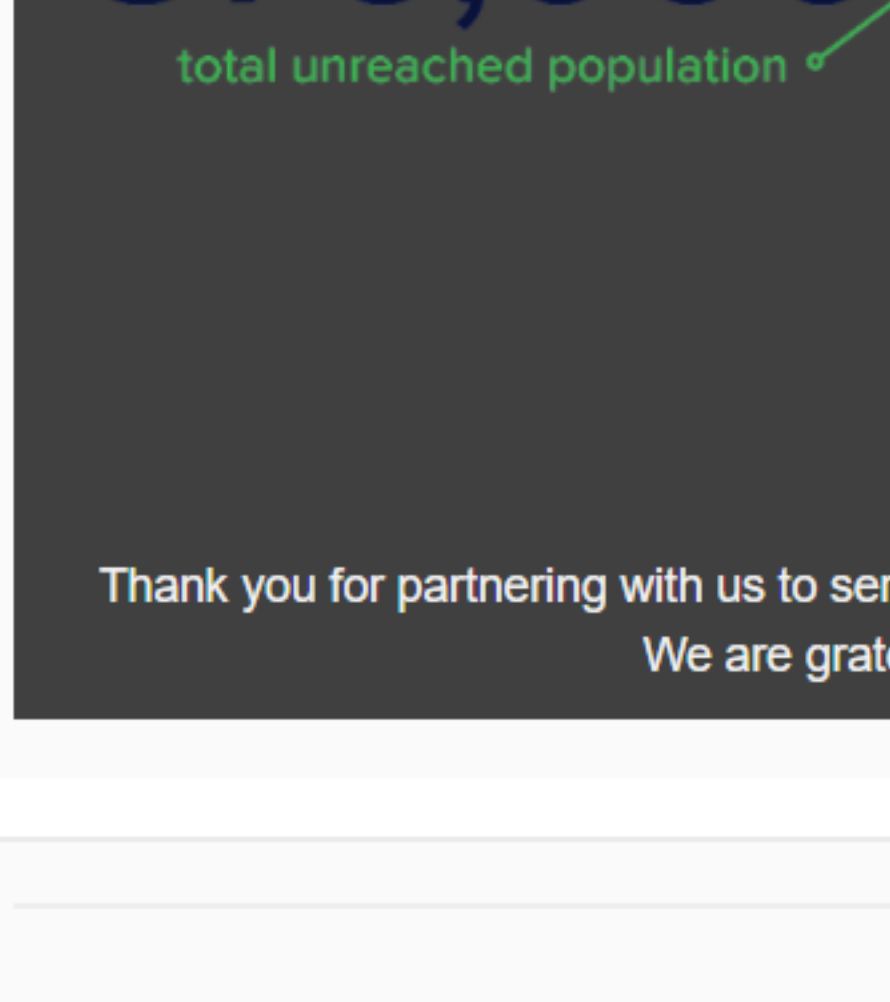
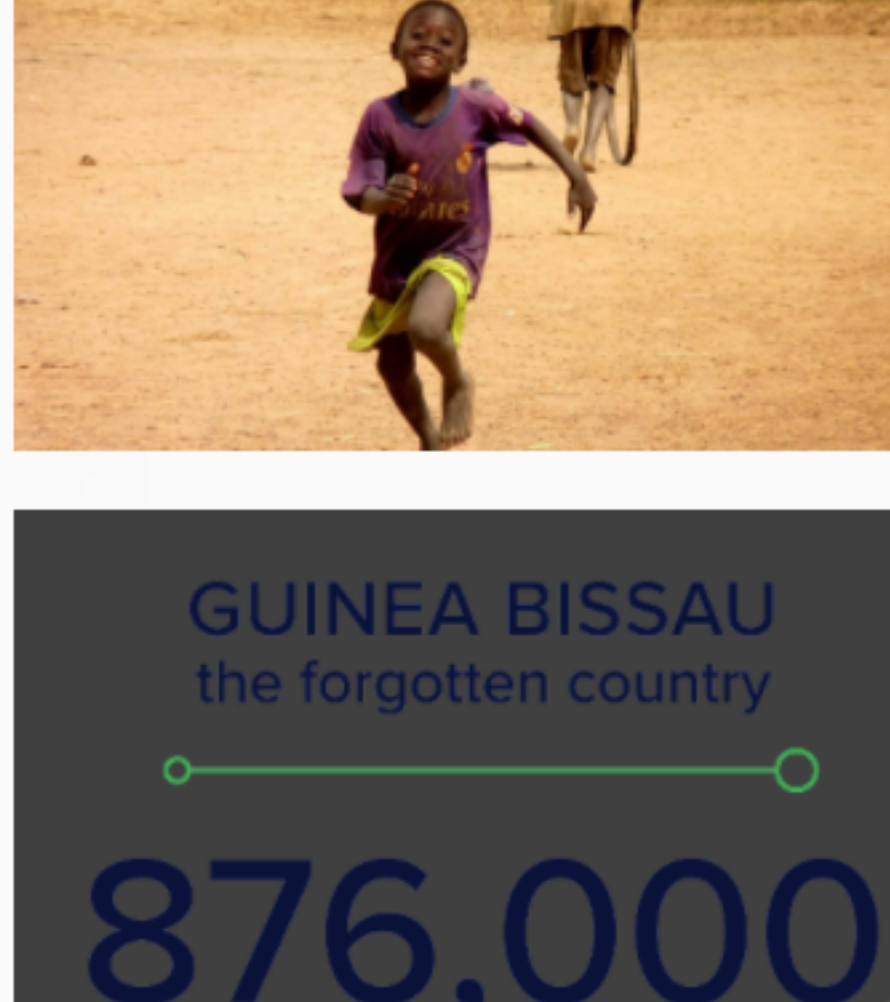
Fredy and Raquel work among the Fula people in a large village close to the Guinea border. Even with the severe threat of Ebola only a couple of miles away, they never left the people they serve.

Fredy works with farming and agriculture, building and staffing schools, discipleship, and church planting.

Raquel is a nurse and runs a medical clinic in the village. She also works in the schools and runs the daily life of their home with around 30 foster children.

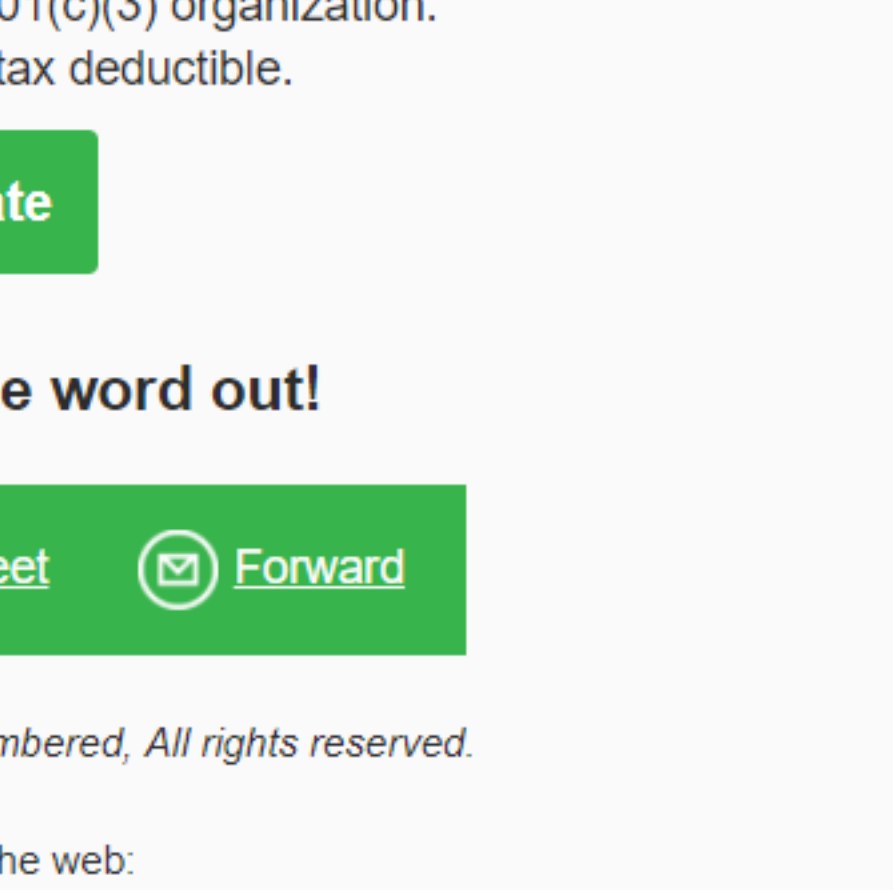
The Schaffer's will mentor and disciple Travis and Sarah as they begin serving full time in Guinea Bissau. We are beyond grateful for this partnership!
