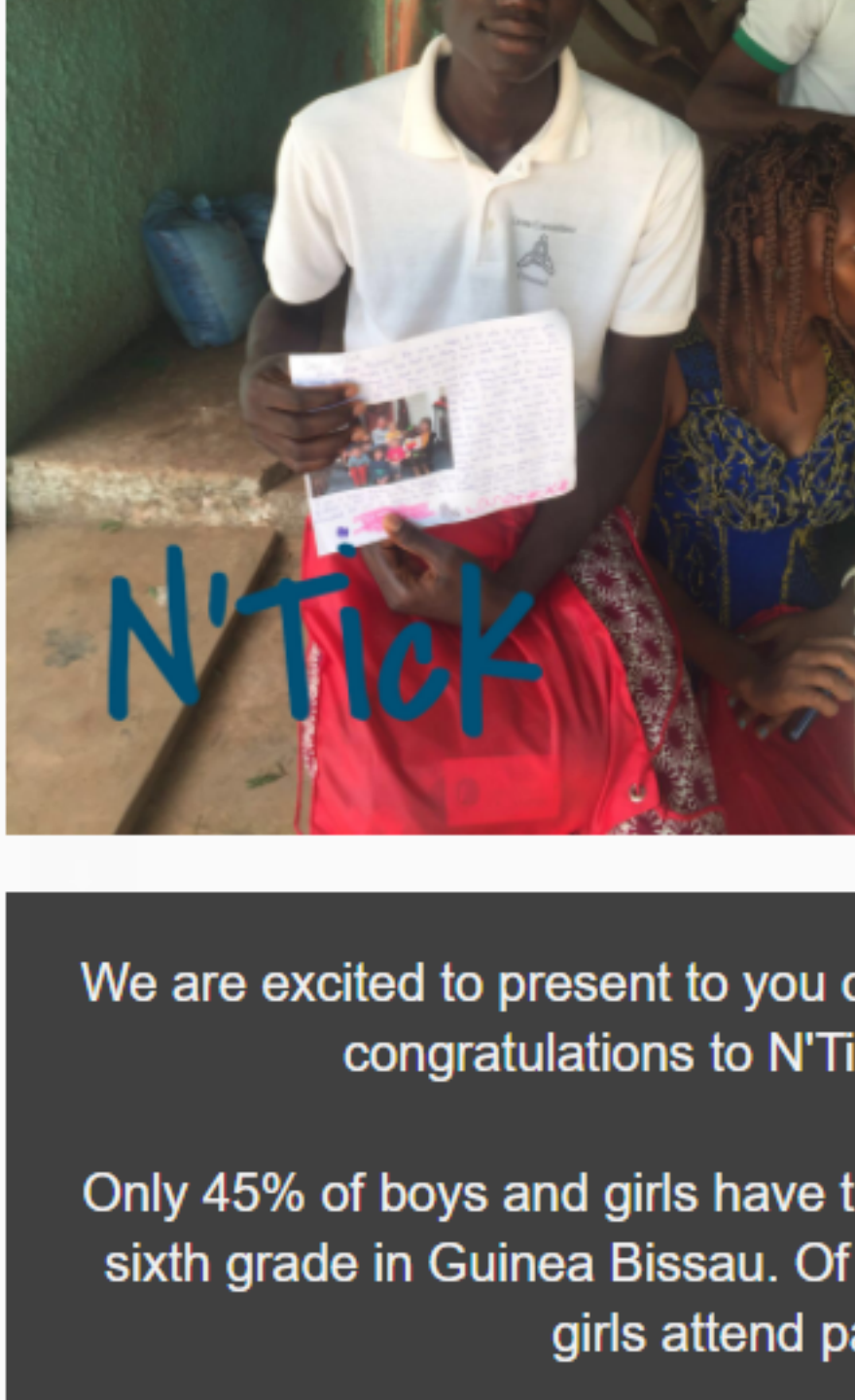

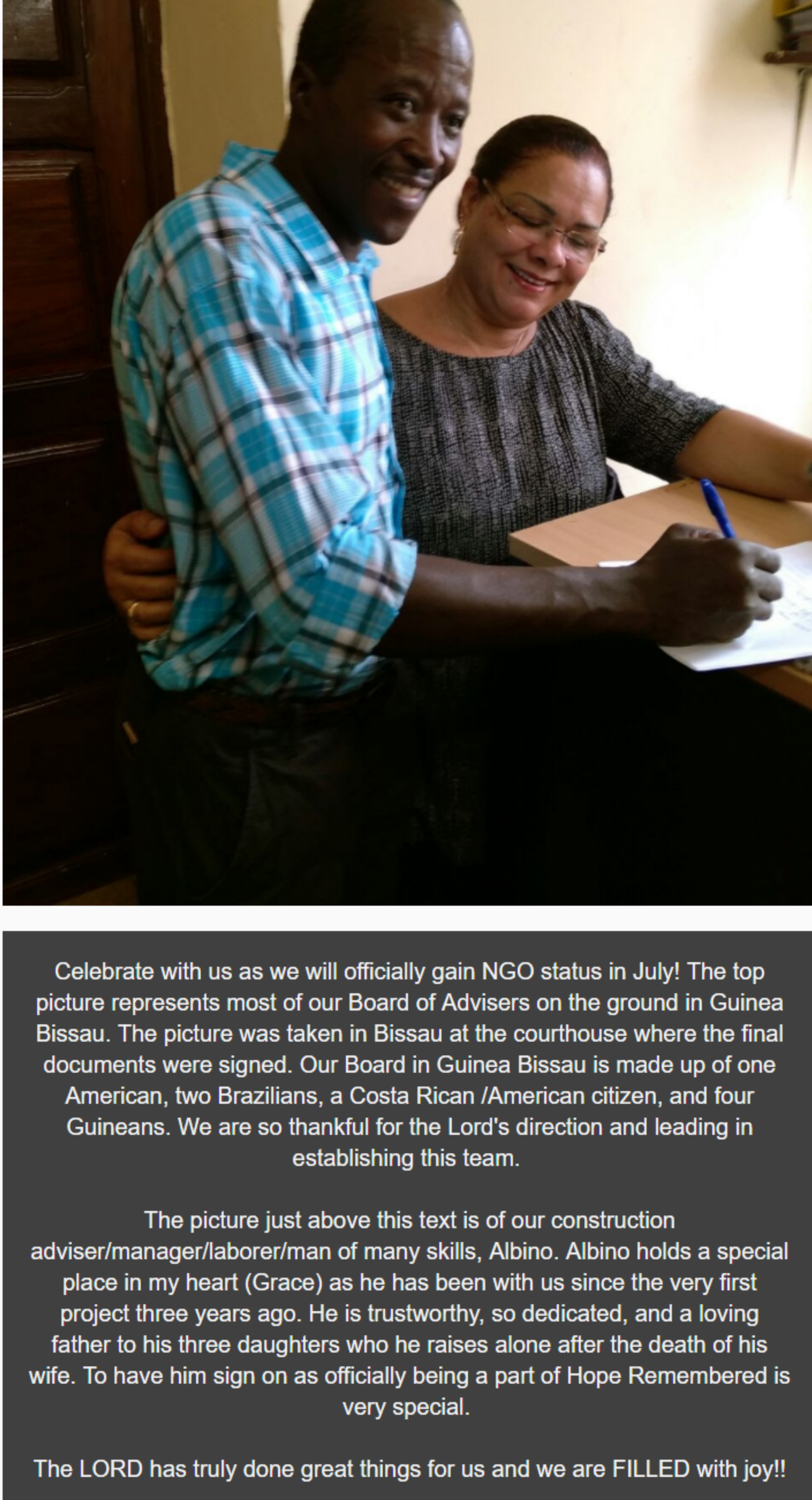
We are excited to present to you our newest high school graduates! A big congratulations to N'Tick and Delcidalia in Bissau.

Only 45% of boys and girls have the opportunity to attend school past the sixth grade in Guinea Bissau. Of that 45%, only 14% of boys and 7% of girls attend past the ninth grade.

When you look at the 21% of students who are fortunate enough to attend high school, only 4% of those students reach graduation.

We are so thankful we could play a small part in helping these students reach an amazing goal. A huge THANK YOU to all of our sponsors who make this possible.

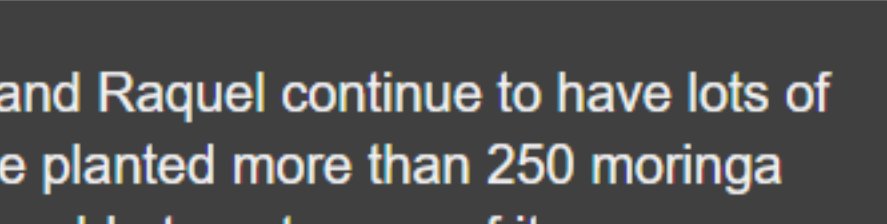
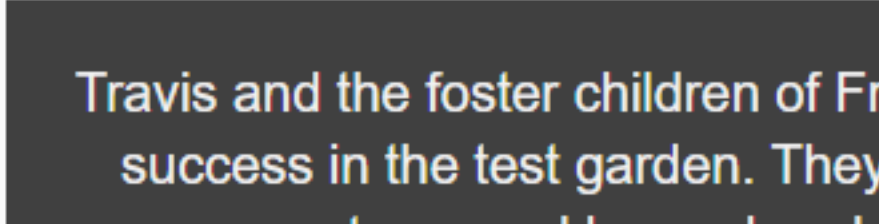
We look forward with much anticipation to what the Lord has in store for these students.

Travis and the team of helpers did all of this by hand using hoes and other basic tools. It is a tremendous amount of work but Travis says they are building great friendships, learning a lot, learning of the Creator, and love the work.
